*Research Interests*

In general, my research is focused on understanding how cultural mixes among individuals (as in the case of bicultural persons) influence their emotions, attitudes, behaviors, and well-being. I am primarily interested in the psychological experiences of Filipino Americans and their mental health, as well as on the psychological processes and effects of oppression/colonization on other historically oppressed groups (e.g., Native Americans, Alaska Natives, etc.). Thus, I investigate the mental health consequences of subtle, overt, historical, contemporary, interpersonal, and institutional discrimination, racism, and oppression. Relatedly, I am also studying the worldwide growth of the indigenous psychology movement and postcolonial psychology. The development of culturally-relevant and sensitive psychological assessment instruments is another major interest.

Thus far, I have published **over 20 journal articles, book chapters, books, or technical reports**, have presented my research **over 20 times in professional conferences**, and have shared my research **over 20 times with various community organizations**.
